GREEN IS IN...OLYMPIA RESIDENTS TAKE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THEIR ENVIRONMENT

Olympia residents pride themselves on maintaining a clean, safe environment for their families and the future. This pride coincides with the "greening of America", a drive by citizens interested in such topics as global warming & air quality to xeriscaping & water conservation. The Village of Wellington strives to provide exceptional customer services and to increase public awareness regarding collection responsibilities and problem resolution. Olympia's collection days are as follows: garbage on Tuesdays and Fridays and recycling on Tuesdays from approved containers. Vegetation and bulk trash on Fridays. These containers must be placed curbside before 7am on your collection day but no earlier than 6pm the day before. They must be removed by 11pm on collection day as required by Village code. Please do not place containers in front of a mailbox. The Village also encourages their Adopt-a-Street program. Look for the signs as you drive through Wellington. The program is a real winner for all.

Join other interested residents of Olympia on Thursday, March 27th at 7pm in the Great Room of the Clubhouse for an organizational meeting of "The Greening of Olympia" Group. This Group will plan an Annual Litter Bug Walk in April & discuss workable ways to "Go Green".

Does Litter Bug You?

- Cleaning up litter costs about 9 times more than it costs to collect trash.
- Fruit takes 2 years to biodegrade and increases wild animal population.
- Cigarette butts take up to 5 years to degrade and contribute to thousands of fires year.
- Litter begets litter and litter leads to lower property values and crime.
