APRIL SHOWERS BRING MAY FLOWERS... OLYMPIA BRIGHTENS UP WITH NATURAL COLOR



In South Florida the list of annuals and vegetables gets shorter as summer approaches. Plant now to maximize color in the coming months. Suggested annuals Include marigolds, amaranthus, asters, marigolds, vincas, zinnias, torenias, portulacas and coleus. Vegetables include sweet potatoes, summer spinach, snap and lima beans and southern peas. Gardenia is one a favorite of Floridians because of the fragrant white flowers. For best results, plant them in an open

flower bed away from house foundations, pools and walkways. They are acid-loving plants, and the high alkalinity near concrete almost guarantees they will have nutritional problems. Fertilize and look for the main show of flowers from mid-April to late May. Prior to any plantings, please have your garden plans approved by your Village and the Master Architectural Review Committees.

Add a little natural color to your garden this month

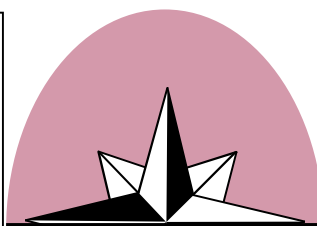
Clubhouse Guidelines

The rules listed below are to benefit all residents & establish an inviting, comfortable atmosphere.

- Residents must show their access card prior to using the facilities.
- Access cards are only for the resident they were issued to; they are not transferable. Clubhouse Staff may confiscate cards if in possession of anyone other than the assigned resident.
- Those under the age of 16 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian 18 years or older, if not they will be asked to leave the facility.
- Shoes must be worn in all areas of the Clubhouse and grounds.
- Each household is allowed up to 6 guests in the Clubhouse and pool area. A resident must be 18 years old to bring guests.
- The resident must accompany guests; if the resident is not with the guests then they will be asked to leave.
- No food, glass, chewing gum or metal objects in the Clubhouse or pool area. Non-alcoholic beverages in plastic bottles are permitted 4' away from the waters edge.
- No alcoholic beverages allowed on the Clubhouse grounds.
- Diaper stage persons must wear a swim diaper at all times.
- No smoking inside the pool gate or anywhere inside the Clubhouse.
- Dress code enforced. Appropriate bathing attire a must.
- The use of the Fitness Center is reserved for residents only. No guests allowed. No one under 16 is allowed to enter the Equipment Area.

Please note this is not a comprehensive list of the policies in the Clubhouse & Pool area.
