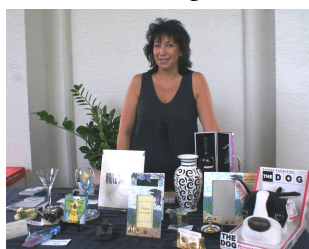

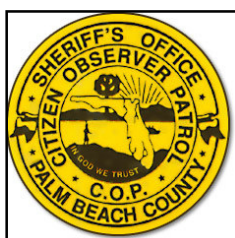

Olympia's Planning a Safe July 4th

Olympia urges its residents to think about safety as they make plans to celebrate the 4th of July. Every year thousands of people are killed or critically injured by fireworks, and more than half of those are children.

"For that reason, fireworks are illegal to use without a permit"

Using fireworks illegally is a first degree misdemeanor punishable by up to one year in jail and a \$1,000 fine.

"IF IT LAUNCHES OR EXPLODES, IT IS OFF LIMITS."

Residents can contact the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office at 688-3400 to report any problems with fireworks.
